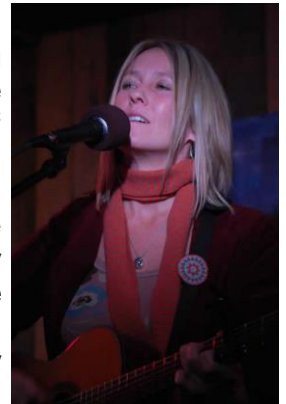


### Phil Christie

A native of Canada, Phil Christie was influenced by fellow countryman Gordon Lightfoot as well as such notable artists as Neil Diamond, Bruce Springsteen, Glen Campbell and John Denver. He scored his own radio success in the '80s before making his way to Los Angeles in 1995. Phil's *Summerstown* CD received airplay on over 200 country and folk stations and earned such critical praise as: "Exceptional! It's one I wished I'd produced" - Milt Okun; "Cream rises to the top and so has Christie." - *Acoustic Scene Magazine*. His song "Mother's Day" was a 2005 Billboard World Song Contest finalist. A Folk Alliance Region-West 2009 Premiere Showcase Artist, Christie has also performed at the Coffee Gallery Backstage, Kerrville Folk Festival (where he was a New Folk Finalist in 2002), South West Florida Folk Festival, and the legendary Bluebird Cafe in Nashville. 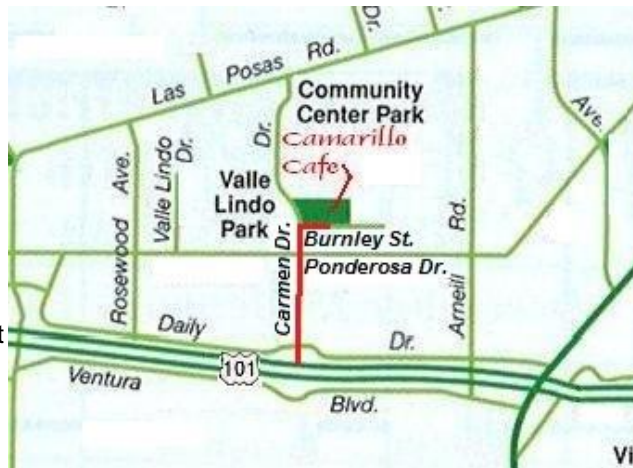
