### Small Potatoes

Nineteen years ago, Jacquie Manning and Rich Prezioso decided to hit the road. "In one year, we quit our jobs, bought a house, bought a car, and became full-time folk singers -- not exactly what most people would call a sound business model." They might not have had the best plan, but what they did have were great songs and musicianship, and the ability to put on a show. After nineteen years, a million and a half miles and 3500 shows (not to mention five Dodge Caravans...) they are listed as a "favorite act" by many coffeehouses, clubs and house concerts across the U.S. (and that includes us!) They have made repeat appearances at major folk festivals, including the Kerrville Folk Festival, the Walnut Valley Festival, and the Philadelphia Folk Festival. From the start, they've called themselves eclectic-maniacs and described their music as "Celtic to Cowboy". They say it has taken them "years of careful indecision" to come up with a mix of music that ranges from country, blues, and swing to Irish, with songwriting that touches on all of those styles and more. Their four recordings demonstrate that "indecision" can be wonderfully entertaining. They both sing and play guitars and an array of other instruments. They even yodel. 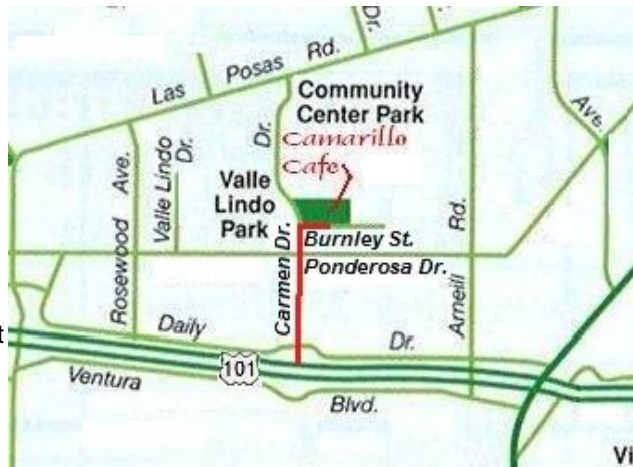
